

WE REALISED WE HAVE GROWN

2019 was an important year for Non Dalla Guerra during which we developed a new line-up: we instituted an “enlarged managing board” composed of 26 members.

This new managing board was formed to better understand, together, which changes were needed in order to improve our activities based on our values and mission.

This new line-up was a sort of “think tank” to implement a generative growth

in Non Dalla Guerra. A process which lasted more than three months, with the aim of fully reaching the goals expressed in our Manifesto, where we declared that words such as encounter, dialogue, non violence and education are essential.

During this time of sharing and reflection, we also reviewed the internal structure of Non Dalla Guerra, in order to become more efficient and at the same time to be able to engage all members to the fullest.

In this perspective we formed a number of committees based on the macro activity sectors (National Projects Commission, Foreign Projects Commission, Raising Awareness Commission, Communication Commission and Internal Training Commission) added to the pre-existing positions such as president, vice president, secretary and treasurer. By creating these commissions we aimed at making the involvement of each member during the activities of the association easier.



ACTIVITIES' OVERVIEW 2019

1. HUMANITARIAN AID PROJECT

In 2019, Non Dalla Guerra supported a project destined to Syrian refugee children and Jordanian children in vulnerable conditions who live in the Karak governorate (in Jordan).

It was an educational project - promoted by Caritas Jordan - that we decided to support because it reflects one of the priorities of our association, which is to say the attention towards new generations and, in particular, those more endangered and marginalized.

2. INTERNATIONAL VOLUNTEERING PROGRAMMES

In 2019, we organized five volunteering programmes: four in Jordan - with a first programme addressed to adults over 30 - and one in Lebanon. 141 participants had the chance during last year to meet Syrian and Iraqi refugee families, build relations with the hosting community and help out in the activities of Caritas Jordan and Caritas Lebanon.

3. PEACE EDUCATION

In 2019 we organized events to report back experiences lived in the Middle East: we carried out our laboratories in schools, Silent Lab activities and other information events aimed at creating awareness on the topics of conflicts and migrations. These were addressed to the citizenry and had a significant role in creating pathways to education and peace, which we set as a priority.

4. AN INTERNATIONAL NETWORK

Among the objectives we reached in 2019, there is the implementation of our international network, with whom we can plan new projects and initiatives. Particularly pretious was the work shared with No Amb la Guerra, Caritas Jordan, the German associations Akija e.V. and Starkmacher e.V., Caritas Lebanon and Caritas Egypt.

All Non Dalla Guerra activities are possible thanks to the dedication and passion of our members. Everyone, based on his or her own sensitivity and competences, has given a significant contribution to reach the results we got during 2019. The initiatives undertaken so far, in fact, arise from a sharing of ideas, opinions and solutions among Non Dalla Guerra members. Last year, ideal spaces for this sharing process were represented by the members meetings and assemblies: moments of sharing, dialogue, formation and growth of the association.

HUMANITARIAN AID PROJECT

Drama Center: when art becomes an instrument of integration

A place dedicated to art, music and theatre. A place designed for children and young people. A place which Non Dalla Guerra helped "building": the Drama Centre of Karak, Jordan. The centre opened its doors last September to become a meeting and sharing point for young vulnerable Jordanians and young Syrian refugees who live in the neighborhood.

This represents a new "cultural" space where young people come together to take part in artistic, theatrical and musical laboratories. Non Dalla Guerra supported this project thanks to the contributions received from the 2018 edition of the Social Day.

The Drama Centre is a project established by Caritas Jordan which aims to create more socialization among 40 Syrian and Jordanian young people through artistic practices, and aspires to give them the opportunity to discover new talents and skills. Most of the Syrian children and young people, inevitably, are still affected by the traumatic effects caused by war, violence and abuses. Psychological stress, anxiety, emargination, difficulty in adapting to a new life context are some of the problems with which they have to cope everyday. At the same time, also many Jordanian children and young people, with risky socio-economic conditions and a vulnerable family environment, are

not immune from these kinds of problems. The Drama Centre was established with the goal to give these children and young people a space in which they can express themselves and gain back their childhood and adolescence.

Thanks to the artistic activity - in Jordan generally inaccessible for the lowest-income part of the population - children involved can explore their own creativity in a protected context which is also very keen on helping them in order to contrast the high child labor rate, the consequent school dropout as well as the their isolation state.

This project is also an important opportunity to convey children and young people, and also to their families, positive messages and good practices of peace education, conflicts resolution, cooperation and integration.

AL KARAK

Al Karak is a small Jordanian Governorate which hosts a significant amount of Syrian refugees, who established here mostly because the cost of life is cheaper compared to other areas of the country. Most families who live in this area, in fact, live in conditions of strong economic disadvantage.

INTERNATIONAL VOLUNTEERING PROGRAMMES

Sand-filled shoes - Jordan 2019

In 2019 we returned to Jordan with more than ninety young volunteers and a group of about twenty adults that participated in our programme for the first time. Young Italians, Spaniards, Portuguese and Jordanians participated in the four volunteer camps that we organized from July to September in Huson, Zarqa, Madaba and Salt, cities where we met a lot of people: not just refugees, but people who have opened their doors to us, who have shared much more than a coffee, by telling us their stories full of pain but also hope. Stories like Enaam's, a young Syrian woman who lives with her four children or Ahmad's, 46, proud of his son's school results, who dreams of becoming an engineer.

JORDAN PILL

Zarqa, July 2019 - "Sami is waiting for us on the second floor of the Caritas Centre in Zarqa. The structure - he explains - offers medical and humanitarian assistance to Syrian refugees and their families. We see the curiosity and distrust in the eyes of the people we meet while being led by Sami, who smiles at everyone. What impresses us, in addition to his positivity, is the ability to endure and the dignity of people waiting. We inflate the balls for the children of the center, while Sami tells us about his life, inviting us to meet his wife in Amman". Mattia, Marta and Francesca - NDG volunteers.

In Huson, Zarqa, Madaba and Salt we met 150 Syrian and Iraqi families during the field visits, we played with hundreds of children, we worked inside Caritas Jordan Centres, we delivered parcels of food and basic necessities to those in need, we improvised as "bricklayers" and "farmers" and learned the art of mosaic. All of the activities had as their common thread the meeting with the other, aimed at building relationships and creating a bridge of dialogue. We went back to Jordan because the sand from our shoes can never be completely taken off.

I speak humanity - Lebanon 2019

2019 was a significant year also because we started a new volunteering programme in Lebanon. We participated in the International Youth Exchange Camp in Amioun, that took place between the end of August and the beginning of September; we organized this camp together with Caritas Lebanon, Caritas Egypt and the German associations Starkmacher e.V. and AKIJA e.V. This project involved almost 30 young people - from Italy, Germany, England, Syria, Lebanon and Egypt - and focused on social entrepreneurship. It represented an experience that allowed volunteers to meet and get to know the entrepreneurial social realities with which Caritas Lebanon collaborates daily, to support the weakest sections of the country's population.



LEBANON PILL

Amioun, September 2019 - "The simplicity and courtesy of the families we met surprised and enriched us. We have discovered a hospitality made up of few words, but rich of gestures and looks, eager to welcome and get to discover us". Chiara - NDG volunteer.

In Lebanon, the population is made up of a large number of Syrian refugees: almost 1.5 million refugees out of a total of 4 and a half million people. In addition to the service activities in the business realities involved in the programme, the volunteers met 20 refugee families and had the opportunity to experience moments of intense cultural exchange given the different nationalities of the camp participants. Fundamental to this experience, however, was the further awareness of how even the simplest ideas can become a source of concrete solidarity thanks to those who, with dedication and commitment, work every day for those in need. Based on this reflection, the slogan "I speak humanity" was born, with which we decided to remember the 2019 edition of the International Youth Exchange Camp.

TESTIMONIALS

Telling the stories of the people we met during our volunteer camps, becoming their “voice”, and ensuring that their suffering and needs are not forgotten are some of the main reasons why we return to Jordan every year. For this reason, Non Dalla Guerra also in 2019 organized testimonial meetings with youth groups, parish groups, schools, scouts and associations throughout Italy. Meetings during which, thanks to the material collected during the volunteering programmes, we showed the living conditions of refugees in the Middle East.

TRAINING WORKSHOPS

What are the consequences of wars? What does it mean to be a migrant, a refugee, a displaced person? What are the causes of migration? How does the refugees' reception system work? What are the geopolitical, historical and contemporary dynamics that affect the Middle East and what are the causes of the conflicts that have struck this area? But also: how do we build a culture of peace and a future of solidarity and respect for fundamental rights? These are some of the questions that we tried to answer during our training workshops for schools and youth groups.

SILENT LAB

Throughout 2019 we carried out 33 Silent Labs around Italy: interactive artistic performances in which the public is the protagonist. A different way to talk about wars, migration, denied rights and encounters with others. A group of viewers, wireless headphones, a voice guide, and you start to take your first steps into a different point of view.

VICENZA

VERSO UN'EUROPA MIGRANTE

Create moments of dialogue and discussion on the theme of migration and understand in depth the reasons that force thousands of people to move from their countries of origin, and also promote a community vision of the phenomenon of migration. With these objectives, in 2019, we organized in Vicenza the exhibition “Towards a Migrant Europe”: a cycle of six meetings, organized together with a group of 10 partner organizations. Among the guests of the exhibition - which involved over 500 people - there were Nello Scavo, Laura Silvia Battaglia, Father Camillo Ripamonti, Francesco Piobbichi and Irene Piccolo.

At the Anita Villalaz theatre in Panama, together with the theatrical production centre La Piccionaia and Caritas Internationalis, we presented the Silent Play “The face of the other”, a performance-show that brought to the stage a reflection on the themes of migratory flows and the encounter between different cultures. Almost 300 young people - from all over the world - took part in Silent Play among whom the president of Caritas Internationalis and Cardinal Luis Antonio Tagle.

AN INTERNATIONAL NETWORK

Beyond the borders

Non Dalla Guerra has always been collaborating with a number of international partners in the realization of different projects. A collaboration that has proved to be fundamental over the years, both with respect to our vision - which goes well beyond the borders within which we operate on a daily basis - as well as to generate new opportunities and establish new contacts with young people from all over the world. Also in 2019 we have tried to develop this international network and its affiliated projects.

There are almost a hundred people who have been involved in the various meetings that we co-organized during last year to plan activities and share working methods together.

With Caritas Jordan, our partner since the foundation of Non Dalla Guerra, during 2019 we participated in two important meetings in Vicenza to plan volunteer camps in Jordan and to evaluate their progress by agreeing on the objectives of the 2020 edition.

Thanks to the consolidated partnership with the German associations Akija e.V. and Starkmacher e.V. we activated the first volunteering programme in Lebanon, the International Youth Exchange Camp, from which stemmed a new partnership with Caritas Lebanon, CAFOD,

Caritas Egypt and Caritas Syria. In 2019, then, with Starkmacher e.V. we worked on the organization of the camp "Media 4 you", a voluntary project to be carried out in Egypt in 2020 that will focus on the role of the media to encourage and develop the civic engagement of young people from Europe and the Middle East.



2019, moreover, is the year in which we began to redefine relations with No Amb la Guerra, a Catalan association that was born after one of our camps in Jordan and with which we continue to collaborate in the organization of volunteer programmes in the Middle East. At the end of last year, in fact, together with NAG we set the guidelines for the establishment of our Confederation, with the aim of creating a common space that allows us to share values and projects concretely responding to the need of global thinking and local acting.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This explanatory note is part of the financial statements for the year of activity, ended the 31 December 2019, of Non Dalla Guerra Association, based in Vicenza, in viale G. Carducci n. 13. The following note shows for the year an operating surplus of 8,926.70 euros. This result brings the Association's liquidity to 31 December 2019 to a value of 24,000 Euros. The 2019 surplus derives from the operating commitments which will end in 2020 and refer to:

- reporting of the activities in accordance with Caritas Jordan of the projects carried out in 2019 and those in progress (volunteering camps and Drama Centre) for a total of 20,100 Euros.

- provisions for donations received for the project Vicini di Banco (fundraising to support the education of Syrian, Iraqi and Jordanian children for the support of school fees) for a total of € 3,605.

The operating surplus, not tied to any operations, is equal to 295 Euros.







«Non Dalla Guerra? We are all afraid of what we don’t know: we need interpretative keys to “read” our world! Non Dalla Guerra offers interpretative keys by telling how the world is: knowledge generates trust, solidarity and cooperation».

«Non Dalla Guerra is not just an association. Nor just a non-profit organization. It is much more. It’s an idea. It is a worldview. It is a dream born in a dusty refugee camp in Jordan. It is the ability to see that refugee camp as a place that hosts people. Not migrants, nor refugees. People. People to build relationships with, people to create solidarity with. Non Dalla Guerra represents solidarity without pietism. A type of volunteering that is not ostentatious, the kind of help that you give in silence. Non Dalla Guerra is awareness and action, in schools and cities. And precisely in one city, Vicenza, the dream of Non Dalla Guerra was born.
